

ISSAI 12 — completed the INTOSAI design: a modern framework for a value-adding SAI, benefitting the citizen



Success factors so that SAIs deserve independence

- ✓ Quality work
- ✓ Timely reports
- ✓ Relevant findings / citizen focus



Essential to demonstrate while seeking full independence:

- Long term strategy to build institutional capacity
- Put in place professionally qualified staff
- Implement professional standards and QA






Independence – enables relevance; obliges accountability
