Importance of SAI Credibility and Effectiveness

"Supreme Audit Institutions need to be independent if they are to be credible and effective" *

* First line of:

"Making SAI Independence a reality: Some lessons across the Commonwealth"



Interdependent factors

Independence >>> Effectiveness and Credibility

But also: Credibility and Effectiveness >>> Independence

Credibility and effectiveness as tools for earning independence



To increase SAI Credibility


- Relevance and Importance of Findings
- Reliability, timeliness of outputs
- External Oversight of SAIs (ISSAI 20)
 - Peer review
 - Audit of SAI financial statements
 - Reporting to the legislature or other Oversight body (eg SAI Board)
 - SAI PMF



Negative impacts on SAI Credibility

- Corruption or other scandals involving SAI officials (current or past)
- Excessive focus on compliance
- Poor quality or late reporting





SAI Effectiveness

- Measuring effectiveness
 - Many good tools: SAI PMF, Peer reviews etc
- Increasing effectiveness
 - Improving financial and performance auditing
 - Using technology
 - Implementing action plans arising from diagnostic reports



Importance of "Promoting Yourself"

Operating as if you already have greater independence

Credibility

- Being accountable to stakeholders
- Factual, nonpolitical reporting
- Avoiding scandal

Effectiveness

- Producing useful, high quality reports
- Delivering products within budget, and in a timely manner
- Rigorous financial audit



World Bank support to SAI Independence

- World Bank and other Partners can support SAIs to gain greater independence
 - Instruments including policy and investment loans, or donor funded projects

Credible and Effective SAIs are more likely to receive donor support
